We are accepting applications from 3rd and 4th year students for the 2016 Summer College Student Program from Thursday, April 14, 2015 to Thursday, May 5, 2016 for a position in our Austin, Texas office.

The Program

The Credit Union Department's College Student Program provides valuable and challenging professional opportunities for outstanding business students. Our goal is to provide Program participants with a better understanding of the Department's role in the financial system while providing an opportunity for public service. Program participants are assigned to a variety of projects that will afford a range of analytical activities and provide credit union regulatory and supervisory experience.

The Summer appointment begins in May for a period not to exceed 13 weeks. A Program participant may apply to extend the appointment for up to two additional semesters.

Why Join the Credit Union Department?

Throughout the recent turmoil in the financial markets, the Credit Union Department has stood strong and has continued to fulfill its 45 year old mission to supervise, regulate and examine Texas-chartered credit unions in order to safeguard the public interest, protect the financial interests of credit union members and promote public confidence in the credit union industry.

As a Program participant you will contribute to maintaining confidence in our state's credit union system and learn financial institutions regulation from the inside out. In addition you may experience unparalleled exposure to the Texas credit union industry.

The student selected for the Program will begin employment as a part-time employee with the Department in the spring semester and will work a mutually agreed upon schedule over the course of the semester. Program participants receive \$12.70 per hour. You may also be paid for state agency holidays that fall within your regularly scheduled workdays.

Education Eligibility Requirements

- The applicant must be enrolled or accepted for enrollment in an under-graduate degree-seeking program;
- The degree program must be in Business Administration with a major in Economics, Banking, Finance, Accounting or a related field;
- The applicant must be eligible to graduate within fifteen months of finishing the Program; and
- The applicant must have at least a cumulative (overall) 3.0 grade point average; and remain in good academic standing during his/her participation in the Program.

Application Requirements

Applicants must submit a completed State of Texas Employment Application to be considered. Resumes may accompany an application but do not substitute for the application.
