New Cyber Incident Notification Requirements

In an environment of increasing fraud, cyberattacks, and cybersecurity breaches, federally insured credit unions have new NCUA cyber incident reporting requirements which became effective September 1, 2023. <u>NCUA Letter to Credit Unions 23-CU-07</u> requires a credit union to report a substantial cyber incident within 72 hours to NCUA, and it should also be reported to the Credit Union Department. NCUA Letter to Credit Unions 23-CU-07 provides guidance on what a credit union needs to do in the event of a cyber incident.

A reportable incident is any "substantial" cyber incident that leads to one or more of the following:

- A substantial loss of confidentiality, integrity, or availability of a network or member information system that results from the unauthorized access to or exposure of sensitive data, disrupts vital member services or has a serious impact on the safety and resiliency of operational systems and processes.
- A disruption of business operations, vital member services, or a member information system resulting from a cyberattack or exploitation of vulnerabilities.
- A disruption of business operations or unauthorized access to sensitive data facilitated through, or caused by, a compromise of a credit union service organization, cloud service provider, or other third-party data hosting provider or by a supply chain compromise.

NCUA and the Credit Union Department require credit unions to take cyber incidents seriously, take immediate action to limit the impact of a cyber incident, and learn what can be done differently in an effort to prevent any future cyber incidents.
